THE GAME

The Hampton University football team (0-1) will have their 2016 home opener this Saturday, returning to Armstrong Stadium for a non-conference game against No. 13/13 William & Mary (0-1) at 6 p.m. The Pirates are coming off a 54-21 loss at Old Dominion, while the Tribe opened the season this past weekend with a 48-14 loss at N.C. State.

MULTIMEDIA

The game will be broadcast on WHOV 88.1 FM and streamed live on the Pirates Sports Network.

THE SERIES

The Pirates are 0-6 all-time against William & Mary, including last season's 40-7 loss at Zable Stadium. Three of the previous five meetings between the two teams have come at Zable Stadium - the last one coming last season. The two teams last met at Armstrong Stadium in 2014, with the Tribe winning 42-14. 1998 and 2004 saw the two closest contests in the series; in 1998, the Tribe won 41-34, and in the 2004 NCAA Div. I FCS playoffs, William & Mary escaped with a 42-35 win.

PIRATES AT HOME

The Pirates went 3-2 at home last season, picking up wins over Kentucky State, Delaware State, and Florida A&M, and in two seasons under head coach Connell Maynor, Hampton is a combined 5-6 at Armstrong Stadium.

PIRATES IN HOME OPENERS

Since 1943, Hampton is 45-27-1 in home openers. Last season's 35-20 home-opening win over Kentucky State snapped a streak of three straight home-opening losses for the Pirates. From 2003-11, Hampton had won nine straight home openers.

The Pirates are 2-15 against teams that currently compete in football in the CAA, with both of those wins coming against James Madison. Hampton is 2-0 against JMU; 0-3 against New Hampshire; 0-3 against Richmond; 0-2 against Rhode Island; 0-1 against Villanova; and 0-6 against William and Mary. The Pirates have never faced Albany, Delaware, Elon, Maine, Stony Brook, or Towson.

PIRATES PICKED TO FINISH FIFTH IN THE MEAC

The MEAC preseason poll, voted on by the league's head coaches and sports information directors, picked the Pirates to finish fifth this season. The Pirates picked up one first-place vote and 265 points, while defending co-champion North Carolina A&T was picked to repeat. Twarn Mixson and Christian Faber-Kinney were both Preseason First Team selections, while Dwayne Garrett, Donovan Johnson, Ryan Gould, and Myles Morris all earned Preseason Third Team honors.

MIXSON LEADING PIRATES' RECEIVERS

Twarn Mixson was a First Team All-MEAC selection and a Black College All-American in 2015, and coming into 2016, he again finds himself on the Preseason All-MEAC First Team. Mixson led the MEAC in both receiving yards (93.4 per game) and receptions (5.4 per game) last season, becoming just the second Pirate ever to have a 1,000-yard receiving season (1,027). Mixson had five 100-yard receiving games last season, including a season-high 172 yards at Savannah State, and he caught a season-high four touchdowns in the season opener against Kentucky State. He also displayed his arm in 2015, completing three of his five pass attempts - and all three completions were for touchdowns.

AT OR NEAR THE TOP OF THE PILE

Last season, the Pirates were at the top or near the top of the MEAC in several statistical categories. Hampton led the conference in field goals (6-for-7), while ranking second in total offense (359.1 yards per game), passing offense (227.5 yards per game), pass efficiency (126.2), and pass efficiency defense (100.1). The Pirates were third in the MEAC in scoring defense (21.2 points per game, tied with North Carolina Central), total defense (306.8 yards per game), red zone defense (67.4 percent), and passing defense (167.3 yards per game).

FABER-KINNEY ONE TO WATCH OUT FOR

After being named Second Team All-MEAC in 2013, punter Christian Faber-Kinney was a First Team All-MEAC selection each of the last two seasons. He led the conference in punting in 2015, averaging 40.9 yards per kick and recording 11 punts of at least 50 yards. He pinned nine punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line, and he had a season-long boot of 59 yards at William & Mary. Faber-Kinney also starred in track & field last season, winning MEAC titles in both the indoor heptathlon and outdoor decathlon.

CARTER MAKING HIS RETURN

Eric Carter Jr. will be in the backfield again this season, making his return after suffering a season-ending knee injury in the Pirates' 2015 opener. Carter was second on the team in rushing as a freshman in 2014, averaging 5.8 yards per carry while racking up 541 yards on 94 carries. He had three 100-yard rushing games that season, including a season-high 120 in an upset of then-nationally ranked Bethune-Cookman. He also had 113 yards at Delaware State and 103 at Howard. Carter had 41 yards on nine carries in his return at Old Dominion, averaging 4.6 yards per carry.

GARRETT WITH A CAREER DAY

Dwayne Garrett had his best game as a Pirates against Florida A&M last season, celebrating Senior Day with a career-high 147 yards on 20 carries and a touchdown for Hampton's lone 100-yard rushing effort of the season. Garrett, a transfer from San Diego State, averaged 7.4 yards per carry, and for the season, he was ninth in the MEAC in rushing with 52.1 yards per game. For the season, Garrett had 478 yards on 87 carries and two touchdowns, averaging 5.5 yards per carry.

DEFENSE PITCHED A SHUTOUT

The Pirates posted their best defensive effort of 2015 in a 33-0 win over Florida A&M in their home finale. Not only did Hampton record its first shutout since 2014 - when the Pirates blanked Delaware State 23-0 - but the Pirates' defense held Florida A&M to just 168 yards of total offense, a season best and the lowest total since 2011, when Hampton held Savannah State to 150 yards. Prior to 2014's shutout of Delaware State, the last time the Pirates shut out an opponent was in 2009; Hampton did it twice that season, beating Howard 37-0 and Florida A&M 25-0.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

Keita Malloy joins the Pirates staff this season to serve as wide receivers coach and special teams coordinator; in the past, Malloy had coached at Old Dominion and was most recently an assistant coach at Norview High in Norfolk, Va. Gary Lowery will coach the Pirates' running backs this season, while Markus Lawrence has moved from coaching the offensive line to the tight ends.

HEAD COACH CONNELL MAYNOR

Connell Maynor is entering his third season as the head coach of the Hampton University football program.

Maynor is a veteran of the game with over 20 years of football experience both as a player and coach -- most recently as the offensive architect of the back to back HBCU national titles at Winston-Salem State. He is the 20th head coach in the history of Hampton University football.

2015 saw the Pirates double their win total from 2014, going 6-5 overall for the program's first winning season since 2011. Hampton went 5-3 in MEAC play last season, including wins over Howard, Delaware State, Morgan State, Florida A&M, and Savannah State.

Four Pirates were named First Team All-MEAC in 2015: wideout Twarn Mixson, offensive lineman Torrian White, defensive end Miles Grooms, and punter Christian Faber-Kinney. In addition, Mixson was named A BoxToRow and SBN Sports All-American.

Other Pirates to earn All-MEAC honors were quarterback David Watford and offensive lineman Michael Young (Second Team), as well as running back Christopher Dukes, defensive lineman Charles Owens, linebacker Joshua Thorne, and return specialist Darius Banks (Third Team).

The Pirates went 3-9 in 2014, Maynor's first season, and his first win as a Div. I head coach came on Sept. 20 when Hampton defeated Miles College 34-30. Maynor's first year also saw the Pirates upset then-nationally ranked Bethune-Cookman 40-35 on national television, a game that knocked the Wildcats out of contention for the conference title.

Hampton also defeated Delaware State 23-0, giving Maynor his first shutout win as a Div. I head coach. It was the first time since 2009 that Hampton had

shut out an opponent.

The Pirates were second in the MEAC in total offense in their first season under Maynor, averaging 381.9 yards per game - including a MEAC-best 218.8 yards per contest in the air. In addition, Hampton was fifth in the MEAC in rushing offense, to the tune of 163.2 yards per game.

Hampton was second in the MEAC in first downs and fourth in pass efficiency.

Mixson and punter Faber-Kinney were First Team All-MEAC selections in Maynor's first season, and Faber-Kinney was also a VaSID Second Team All-State selection. Running back Jorrian Washington, offensive lineman Kory Alpichi, and Thorne were Second Team All-MEAC selections.

Offensive lineman Ronald Rose and Grooms were named Third Team All-MEAC, giving the Pirates seven All-Conference honorees in Maynor's first season.

Maynor, a former standout football student-athlete at both Winston-Salem State and North Carolina A&T, has developed a reputation as one of the game's brightest offensive minds, and he brings to Hampton a sterling resume and championship pedigree.

In four years at WSSU, Maynor went 45-6 overall and 29-2 in CIAA play. He won three straight CIAA championships and made three straight appearances in the NCAA Div. II playoffs. In 2011, the Rams made it to the national semifinals, before appearing in the Div. II national championship game in 2012.

WSSU won HBCU national championships in both 2011 and 2012.

He was also named CIAA Coach of the Year in 2011 and 2012, as well as earning Boxtorow HBCU Coach of the Year, Pigskin Club of Washington, D.C. CIAA Coach of the Year, Black College Sports Page BAAD Team Coach of the Year, and Don Hansen Football Gazette Super Region One Coach of the Year.

Maynor was also named the 2011 Sheridan Broadcasting National HBCU Coach of the Year.

Maynor went to WSSU by way of Fayetteville State, where he spent 10 seasons as a member of the Broncos' award-winning football staff, most recently serving as both the quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator, where he helped to lead FSU to four CIAA title game appearances and three CIAA Championships (2002, 2003 and 2009).

In addition to his collegiate coaching responsibilities, Maynor served as the offensive coordinator for the Arena Football League's Philadelphia Soul from 2006-2008 where he helped to lead the Soul to the Arena Bowl XXII World Championship in 2008.

Under his leadership the Soul ranked first in scoring offense (62 points per game), touchdowns (132), touchdown passes (102), and red zone efficiency (85 percent) in 2008 en route to an Arena Bowl title.

Maynor's successes have come not only as a coach, but as a player as he has earned six championships as an athlete.

The starting quarterback for the Rams' 1987 CIAA championship football team under then-head coach and current-WSSU Director of Athletics William "Bill" Hayes, Maynor was named to the All-CIAA team as a freshman after passing for 1,071 yards.

After following Hayes to North Carolina A&T, Maynor was named First-Team All-MEAC in both 1990 and 1991. In addition, Maynor was named the MEAC Offensive Player of the Year and was honored as the 100% Wrong Club Player of the Year in both 1990 and 1991 en route to leading the Aggies to the 1991 MEAC championship.

He was inducted into the North Carolina A&T Sports Hall of Fame in 2014.

WILLIAM & MARY HEAD COACH JIMMYE LAYCOCK

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than the College of William & Mary has with Jimmye Laycock. In a tenure that now stretches into its 37th season, Laycock has worked hand-in-hand with the university's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

On June 21, 2008, the College dedicated the \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides the College with one of the finest facilities in the Football Championship Subdivision and, paired with Laycock's steady leadership, gives the Tribe the necessary resources to compete at the highest level.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in W&M's 122-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization awarded outstanding academic achievement. When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the College would produce nearly five times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 36 seasons.

The accumulated successes, both on and off the field, have led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to the consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$27 Zable Stadium renovation project that was completed in the summer of 2016. The rejuvenated stadium, which includes and upper deck, luxury suites and a spacious state-of-the-art press box, provides an enhanced game day experience for both student-athletes as well as Tribe alumni and supporters.

During Laycock's remarkable tenure, the fans at Zable have consistently been treated to a winner on the field, as the program's mentor ranks third in wins among all active active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches. Laycock also ranks second all-time among conference head coaches in league wins with 106.

Laycock has made the home turf in Zable Stadium into unfriendly territory for opponents as the Tribe has won 70.9 percent of its games (130-53-1) in Williamsburg during the last 32 years. During that impressive stretch, W&M has totaled 10 undefeated regular season home campaigns.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 43 players earn 123 All-America honors at W&M and coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With a school-record 20 all-league recognitions in 2015, the Tribe has produced an astounding 240 all-conference selections since 1993. Former All-American running back Jonathan Grimes accounted for 11 of those honors, as he became the most decorated player in conference history in 2011. Former All-American cornerback B.W. Webb nearly matched that impressive when he finished his career in 2012 with nine postseason all-conference honors.

2016 PIRATES AT A GLANCE

The 2015 season was year two under head coach Connell Maynor, and the Hampton University football team saw a marked improvement - going from three wins to six wins on the season and winding up with a winning record in conference play. The Pirates went 6-5 in 2015, their first winning season since 2011, and their 5-3 mark in MEAC play was a far cry from 2014's 2-6 record.

"I thought it was a successful season," Maynor said of 2015. "Now we have to try to get to the next level and compete for the championship. We need to beat the teams we beat last year, and then beat the schools we lost to a year ago."

Despite having to replace the quarterback production from a year ago, as well as much of the defensive production up front, Maynor expects the Pirates to be competitive again in 2016. Younger players stepping into larger roles, as well as some key returners, have Hampton looking at bigger and better things.

OFFENSE

Replacing David Watford, who was the Pirates' quarterback in 2015, won't be easy. After all, Watford threw for 2,088 yards and 21 touchdowns a season ago, earning Second Team All-MEAC honors while leading the conference in passing yards and ranking second in total offense. Watford also ranks second in program history in touchdowns in a single season, third in completions in a single season, and fourth in passing yards in a single season.

But with both Watford and Jerrell Antoine gone, chances are Maynor will turn to rising senior Jaylian Williamson. The product of Chesapeake's Oscar Smith High School didn't play in 2015, but 2014 saw him set the school record for passing yards in a game - 407 at Old Dominion - and complete just over 63 percent of his passes on the season.

Williamson also had 335 passing yards in 2014 against William & Mary.

Still, Maynor wouldn't go so far as to name Williamson the starter, saying there would be an offseason competition between he, redshirt freshman Wesley Wolfolk, and graduate Malik Watson - who will transfer into the program from San Jose State.

"(Williamson) knows the offense as well as anybody," Maynor said.

The Pirates also lose their top rusher from a season ago in Christopher Dukes and, but they will welcome back Eric Carter Jr. to the backfield. Carter, who as a freshman in 2014 averaged almost six yards per carry and had three 100-yard rushing games, will return after a season-ending knee injury he suffered early in 2015.

"(Carter) told me if we had to play this week, he could play," Maynor said. "Losing him in the first game of the season last year... that could've cost us a game or two, so we're looking forward to having him back this year."

The Pirates will also benefit from the return of Dwayne Garrett, who split the running duties with Dukes in 2015 - and had his best career game against Florida A&M, rushing 20 times for a career-high 147 yards and a score.

Whoever winds up behind center will also have plenty of options when it comes to throwing the ball - not the least of which is returning Black College All-American Twarn Mixson. Mixson, who was also a First Team All-MEAC selection a year ago, is coming off a 2015 season that saw him catch 59 passes for 1,027 yards and nine touchdowns. Mixson is just

the second Pirate ever to record a 1,000-yard receiving season (Jeremy Gilchrist had 1,043 receiving yards in 2007).

But the focus will undoubtedly be on Mixson - "T.J.'s gonna demand a double team," Maynor said. "I hope (other teams) don't double-team him, but I'm assuming they will." - which could open things up for the rest of the Pirate receivers - including the likes of Rashawn Proctor, Leon Shorter, and Shakim Alonzo.

Proctor was third on the team in receiving last season, with 21 catches for 326 yards and four touchdowns, while Leon Shorter was fourth on the team in receiving. Proctor and Shorter averaged 15.5 and 12.1 yards per reception, respectively, last season - while three of Alonzo's eight receptions last season were for touchdowns.

But the key to it all might be up front; redshirt senior Michael Young, who was a Second Team All-MEAC performer on the offensive line last season, will return to anchor the front line. Hampton's offensive line helped the Pirates rush for nearly 131 yards per game last season, and the Pirates were second in the MEAC in total offense (359.1 yards per contest).

But Young's not the only veteran presence up front; Maynor expects junior Ryan Gould to have a good season - perhaps an all-conference season - as well as senior Donovan Johnson, senior Gabe Murphy, and a handful of incoming players who expect to give the offensive line some size and depth.

DEFENSE

Much of the Pirates' defensive production in the front seven from a year ago is gone - including All-MEAC performers in Miles Grooms and Joshua Thorne, as well as reliable veterans like Keith McAfee - who had anchored a Pirates defensive unit in 2015 that gave up 10 points or fewer in four of its last six games. That included a 33-0 shutout of Florida A&M and a 42-3 defeat of Savannah State to close out the season.

But even with the losses up front, Maynor is confident.

"We're gonna have to depend on the young guys on that side of the ball," he said. "The secondary was pretty young (last season), and most of those guys are back, so we'll be pretty solid there, but we lost some key members in the front seven."

Owen Obasuyi is one player Maynor expects to step up in 2016, coming off a sophomore season that saw him rack up 22 tackles. But the fact that he has two years under his belt with this system, Maynor expects him to be one of the leaders on defense in the coming season.

But the Pirates' top returning tackler is a member of the defensive backfield; Chaka Diarrassouba had 42 tackles a season ago for the Pirates, including eight each against Howard and at William & Mary. He'll he joined in the backfield by Michigan State transfer Justin Williams, who will be in his second season with the program, as well as Oral Varcciann, whose freshman highlight came against Delaware State, when he returned a fumble 83 yards for a touchdown.

Among those on the defensive line in 2016 will be redshirt sophomore

Devante Spruill and sophomore Darien Williams. Williams, who had 19 tackles as a freshman, was named MEAC Rookie of the Week on Oct. 19 of last season after a seven-tackle, 1.5-sack performance at Morgan State.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Both of the Pirates' kickers in 2016 are veteran returners: rising senior Adam Brown will handle the kickoff duties, while Christian Faber-Kinney will once again trade in his track suit for pads to serve as the Pirates' punter.

"It takes all three aspects to win: offense, defense, and special teams," Maynor said. "When you've got two good kickers, you're so far ahead of the game."

Brown made six of his seven field goal attempts in 2015, including a season-long 39-yarder against Florida A&M. Brown, who was also 36-for-38 in extra points last season, was a perfect 6-for-6 in field goals ranging between 30 and 39 yards, while also handling kickoff duties.

"He just didn't have a lot of (field goal) attempts last year," Maynor said.

On top of being a track & field standout (he won the MEAC championship in both the indoor heptathlon and outdoor decathlon last season), Faber-Kinney was a First Team All-MEAC selection at punter for the second straight year. He led the conference in punting last season, averaging almost 41 yards per boot and recording just two touchbacks on the season.

In the return game, Maynor expects Ronald Bell, who redshirted in 2015 to return some kicks, along with Chase Powell and Myles Morris. Maynor even hinted that Mixson might wind up returning a few punts.

SCHEDULE

Much like other recent seasons, the 2016 campaign will be a tough one to open for the Pirates. Hampton will open on Sept. 3 at Old Dominion, an FBS program, before the Pirates hold their home opener on Sept. 10 against perennial FCS contender William & Mary.

"I hope we get out of those games healthy," Maynor said. "(These games) will let us know where we're at, where we have to go as a program."

MEAC play will then open on Sept. 17 with the Nation's Football Classic against rival Howard, before the Pirates head to Greensboro, N.C. on Thursday, Sept. 29 to take on North Carolina A&T - which has won a share of the last two MEAC titles and won the inaugural Celebration Bowl last season.

"They're a very tough team," Maynor said of A&T. "They don't make a lot of mistakes. You have to be on you're a Game to beat those guys. We had an opportunity last year, it was tight in the fourth quarter, then they scored 14 unanswered points. We're gonna see if we can get over the hump this year."

A road game against Delaware State will follow on Oct. 8, before the Pirates return to Armstrong Stadium for Homecoming on Oct. 15 against

Morgan State. A trip to Tallahassee, Fla. on Oct. 22 follows, as the Pirates square off against Florida A&M.

Hampton will then have three straight at home: South Carolina State on Oct. 29, Savannah State on Nov. 12, and the home finale against rival Norfolk State on Nov. 19.

"Hopefully, there will be a lot riding on (the Norfolk State game)," Maynor said. "They beat us the last two years, so we need to try to change that. We got the Howard rivalry turned around, now we need to get the Norfolk State rivalry turned around."

The regular season will wrap up on Nov. 26 with a trip to Conway, S.C. to take on Coastal Carolina.

But the improvements the team has made in its first two seasons under Maynor, will 2016 be a failure if the Pirates don't win the MEAC and represent the conference in the Celebration Bowl?

"I don't think so," Maynor said. "This is year three, and it usually takes four or five years to get a program turned around and competing at a championship level. So I wouldn't say 'Atlanta or bust,' I just think we need to have another winning season and be competitive, be right there in the big games, show that we're still going uphill, going in the right direction."
