#### THE GAME

#### PIRATES ON THE ROAD

Hampton opened the 2016 season with a road game at Old Dominion, falling 54-21, before falling 31-9 at North Carolina A&T on Sept. 29, defeating Delaware State 27-17 on Oct. 8, and falling 31-14 at Florida A&M. They ended the 2016 season losing at Coastal Carolina 26-7. The Pirates are a combined 4-12 in true road games under head coach Connell Maynor.

# PIRATES PICKED TO FINISH FIFTH IN THE MEAC

After finishing in a share of third place in the 2016 MEAC season, the 2017 MEAC preseason poll, voted on by the league's head coaches and sports information directors, picked the Pirates to finish fifth this season. The Pirates picked up one first-place vote, while defending champion North Carolina Central was picked to repeat. Yahkee Johnson was a Preseason First Team selection, while Steven Smith and Brendan Cole earned Preseason Second Team honors.

# JOHNSON LOOKING TO FINISH IN STYLE

Yahkee Johnson is heading into his senior season looking to finish off his career in style. The Richmond, Va. Native enters his senior campaign off a preseason first team All-MEAC selection as he ran for 763 yards as a junior. He had his breakout with the Pirates on Sept. 10, 2016 rushing for a game-high 115 yards on 12 carries against William & Mary.

# FROM POP WARNER TO COLLEGE TEAMMATES

One wouldn't imagine a pair of kids starting off in football winding up as college teammates. Steven Smith and Delmon Williams were opponents growing up in a local youth league championship game, while years later they both were teammates at Hampton University. Smith, a senior linebacker from Virginia Beach and Williams, a senior quarterback from Norfolk, as one would imagine have different versions of how that youth game finished.

# SMITH/COLE LEADING CHARGE ON DEFENSE

Smith is the leading returning tackler from 2016 as he amassed 61 tackles and topped the team in tackles for a loss (10.5), sacks (4.5) and quarterback hurries (10). Right behind him is senior Brendan Cole who had 54 tackles, four pass deflections, three pass breakups and three fumble recoveries. These two were key in a defense that finished second in the MEAC in total defense in 2016 allowing 340.5 yards per game.

# **HEAD COACH CONNELL MAYNOR**

Connell Maynor is beginning his fourth season as the head coach of the Hampton University football program.

Maynor is a veteran of the game with over 20 years of football experience both as a player and coach -- most recently as the offensive architect of the back to back HBCU national titles at Winston-Salem State. He is the 20th head coach in the history of Hampton University football.

The 2016 Pirates finished 5-6 overall and 5-3 in MEAC play to tie for third with South Carolina State. Hampton snapped an eight-game losing skid to the Bulldogs with a 28-26 win at Armstrong Stadium and had wins in four out of five games down the stretch of the season.

Senior wide receiver Rashawn Proctor was named First Team All-MEAC in 2016 making it the third straight year that the Pirates had a first team receiver. Joining Proctor in post-season honors were running back Yahkee Johnson, tight end Jack Willenbrock, offensive lineman Johnny Cruz and punter Christian Faber-Kinney on the second team. Earning third team All-MEAC was quarterback Jaylian Williamson, linebacker Devin Vandyke and defensive back Brendan Cole.

2015 saw the Pirates double their win total from 2014, going 6-5 overall for the program's first winning season since 2011. Hampton

went 5-3 in MEAC play last season, including wins over Howard, Delaware State, Morgan State, Florida A&M, and Savannah State.

Four Pirates were named First Team All-MEAC in 2015: wideout Twarn Mixson, offensive lineman Torrian White, defensive end Miles Grooms, and punter Christian Faber-Kinney. In addition, Mixson was named A BoxToRow and SBN Sports All-American.

Other Pirates to earn All-MEAC honors were quarterback David Watford and offensive lineman Michael Young (Second Team), as well as running back Christopher Dukes, defensive lineman Charles Owens, linebacker Joshua Thorne, and return specialist Darius Banks (Third Team).

The Pirates went 3-9 in 2014, Maynor's first season, and his first win as a Div. I head coach came on Sept. 20 when Hampton defeated Miles College 34-30. Maynor's first year also saw the Pirates upset then-nationally ranked Bethune-Cookman 40-35 on national television, a game that knocked the Wildcats out of contention for the conference title.

Hampton also defeated Delaware State 23-0, giving Maynor his first shutout win as a Div. I head coach. It was the first time since 2009 that Hampton had shut out an opponent.

The Pirates were second in the MEAC in total offense in their first season under Maynor, averaging 381.9 yards per game - including a MEAC-best 218.8 yards per contest in the air. In addition, Hampton was fifth in the MEAC in rushing offense, to the tune of 163.2 yards per game.

Hampton was second in the MEAC in first downs and fourth in pass efficiency.

Mixson and Faber-Kinney were First Team All-MEAC selections in Maynor's first season, and Faber-Kinney was also a VaSID Second Team All-State selection. Running back Jorrian Washington, offensive lineman Kory Alpichi, and Thorne were Second Team All-MEAC selections.

Offensive lineman Ronald Rose and Grooms were named Third Team All-MEAC, giving the Pirates seven All-Conference honorees in Maynor's first season.

Maynor, a former standout football student-athlete at both Winston-Salem State and North Carolina A&T, has developed a reputation as one of the game's brightest offensive minds, and he brings to Hampton a sterling resume and championship pedigree.

In four years at WSSU, Maynor went 45-6 overall and 29-2 in CIAA play. He won three straight CIAA championships and made three straight appearances in the NCAA Div. II playoffs. In 2011, the Rams made it to the national semifinals, before appearing in the Div. II national championship game in 2012.

WSSU won HBCU national championships in both 2011 and 2012.

He was also named CIAA Coach of the Year in 2011 and 2012, as well as earning Boxtorow HBCU Coach of the Year, Pigskin Club of Washington, D.C. CIAA Coach of the Year, Black College Sports Page BAAD Team Coach of the Year, and Don Hansen Football Gazette Super Region One Coach of the Year.

Maynor was also named the 2011 Sheridan Broadcasting National HBCU Coach of the Year.

Maynor brings more than two decades of football experience both as a coach and as a player in the intercollegiate and professional ranks and is the proud owner of 10 championships, six as a player and four as a coach.

Maynor went to WSSU by way of Fayetteville State, where he spent 10 seasons as a member of the Broncos' award-winning football staff, most recently serving as both the quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator, where he helped to lead FSU to four CIAA title game appearances and three CIAA Championships (2002, 2003 and 2009).

In addition to his collegiate coaching responsibilities, Maynor served as the offensive coordinator for the Arena Football League's Philadelphia Soul from 2006-2008 where he helped to lead the Soul to the Arena Bowl XXII World Championship in 2008.

Under his leadership the Soul ranked first in scoring offense (62 points per game), touchdowns (132), touchdown passes (102), and red zone efficiency (85 percent) in 2008 en route to an Arena Bowl title.

Maynor's successes have come not only as a coach, but as a player as he has earned six championships as an athlete.

The starting quarterback for the Rams' 1987 CIAA championship football team under then-head coach and current-WSSU Director of Athletics William "Bill" Hayes, Maynor was named to the All-CIAA team as a freshman after passing for 1,071 yards.

After following Hayes to North Carolina A&T, Maynor was named First-Team All-MEAC in both 1990 and 1991. In addition, Maynor was named the MEAC Offensive Player of the Year and was honored as the 100% Wrong Club Player of the Year in both 1990 and 1991 en route to leading the Aggies to the 1991 MEAC championship.

In 2014, Maynor was inducted into the North Carolina A&T Sports Hall of Fame.

A veteran of 12 years in the Arena Football League (AFL), Maynor

is a four-time AFL World Champion, having led the Tampa Bay Storm to the 1993 and 1994 World Championships -- in addition to quarterbacking the Orlando Predators to the 1998 and 2000 World Championship titles. For his effort, Maynor was named the Arena Bowl Most Valuable Player in 2000.

A veteran of both the CIAA and the MEAC, Maynor has extensive experience at the both the Division I and Division II levels, and he has demonstrated extensive recruiting acumen, which will immediately help him at Hampton University as he prepares to lead the Pirates back to glory.

#### OHIO UNIVERSITY HEAD COACH JOE MOGLIA

Head Coach Frank Solich has tuned the Ohio football program from one of the least successful in the NCAA to the benchmark of consistency among the Mid-American Conference. Now in his 13th season (19th overall), the Bobcats have been bowl-eligible in nine of the last 10 years, having won 76 games since 2006 - the most among any team in the Mid-American Conference East Division - and have had student-athletes selected in the NFL Draft in seven of the past 10 seasons.

Solich, along with offensive coordinator, Tim Albin, and defensive coordinator, Jimmy Burrow, make up the only head coach and coordinator trio that has been together for 13 years at the same school in the entire FBS.

In 2016, the Bobcats returned to the Marathon Mid-American Conference Championship game where they gave No. 17 Western Michigan a scare in a hard fought 29-23 loss at Ford Field before traveling to the 2016 Dollar General Bowl in Mobile, Ala., Ohio's eighth bowl appearance in 10 years. Ohio leads the MAC with eight straight years of bowl eligibility, appearing in seven bowl games during that time.

Ohio's MAC East title was the third under Solich and 10 Bobcats earned All-MAC honors following the season including senior defensive end Tarell Basham being named MAC Defensive Player of the Year and redshirt freshman safety Javon Hagan earning Freshman of the Year. Basham was selected with the 80th pick in the 2017 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts while senior linebacker Blair Brown was chosen with the 148th by the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Ohio's defense ranked fifth nationally and led the MAC in rushing defense while also setting the team sack record with 44. Basham set single-season and career records in individual sacks finishing his career at Ohio with 29.5 career sacks and 11.5 sacks in 2017.

Conference (MEAC) last year with a 5-6 record and a 5-3 conference record, the 2017 edition of the Hampton Pirates will have a mix of young and new for a deep run in the conference this fall.

#### **OFFENSE**

The Pirates will again have a new look behind center as senior Jaylian Williamson finished his career last season leading the MEAC in passing yards per game at 208 and was a third-team All-MEAC selection. Williamson threw for 2290 yards and 11 touchdowns last season after missing the 2015 campaign.

Three players have an early shot at the top spot on the depth chart between graduate student Brandon Cox, junior college transfer Delman Williams and freshman Brendan Greene.

Cox, who started his career at Utah, saw action in five games last year completing 60% of his passes and ran for a season-high 21 yards against Old Dominion. Williams, a Norfolk native, completed 58% of his passes in 2016 for 2,510 yards and 18 touchdowns at San Jose City College. Greene is from Columbia, SC and AC Flora High School.

In the backfield, junior Yahkee Johnson returns as the leading rusher from 2016 and a second-team All-MEAC selection. Johnson ran for 763 yards, four touchdowns and was fourth in the league in yards per game at 69.4.

"We should be good in the backfield with the speedy Johnson and some newcomers we signed to take over the bruising back role," Maynor said.

Wide receivers will have a young, but explosive group after losing the top three receivers from 2015. Johnson was the leading returning receiver with 22 catches for 192 yards in 2016. "We will have a small, young and talented group this year who will have to step up with no (Rashawn) Proctor or (TJ) Mixson," said Maynor. "As we get into the season, I think this group will be better and better with time," he added.

A mix of the young and the old summarizes the offensive line in 2017. With the experience of juniors Ryan Gould (6-2, 329) and Donovan Johnson (6-2, 318), to go with the youth of redshirt freshman Gibril Ghee (6-1, 307) and Malik Mackey (6-7, 344) will provide a solid base for the offense in 2017.

#### **DEFENSE**

The defensive line will have several key returnees including juniors Owen Obasuyi (6-4, 308) and Darrius Commissiong (6-2, 305). Obasuyi had 41 tackles last year, six for a loss and two sacks, while Commissiong showed flashes with 20 tackles, three for a loss and 2.5 sacks. "Owen and Darrius will be the leaders on the d-line this year and can cause havoc in the opposing backfields," Maynor

said. "With those two along with (Steve) Smith coming off the edge and (Davonte) Spruill we have some talent on the line," he added.

Linebackers are another area that Maynor is pleased with the talent returning this year. Smith was the second leading tackler last year with 61, while adding 10.5 for a loss and 4.5 sacks. Brendan Cole, who can also see action at safety, added 54 tackles, three pass breakups, four pass deflections and had team-high three fumble recoveries will also provide depth at linebackers.

The defensive secondary was battle toughened last season and came back stronger for 2017. Joining Cole as leaders in the secondary will be sophomore Robert Scott, IV after a freshman season with 33 tackles, seven pass breakups, nine pass deflections and a team-best two interceptions. "With Scott and Cole along with (Chaka) Diarrassouba we will be good in the secondary," Maynor said. "We brought in some talented newcomers who will provide quality depth."

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS**

One area that Hampton returns its weapons is in the kicking game. Adam Brown and Anthony Provost handled the kicking duties and were a definite 1-2 combo.

Brown hit both of his field goals, including a 51-yarder against Howard at RFK Stadium. He averaged 50 yards per kickoff with four touchbacks. Prevost hit four field goals and was a perfect 22-of-22 on extra-points. He also had a hand in long-snapping and was credited with tackles.

"I have confidence in both (Anthony) Prevost and (Adam) Brown," said Maynor. "Prevost also did some long-snapping last year and could see time there. He got downfield and made a few stops last year."

Punting will be a new area for the Pirates after losing three-time All-MEAC punter Christian Faber-Kinney. "We will be relying heavily on the punt-coverage unit to start the year as we will be breaking in a new punter," Maynor added.

The return game will be handled again by a main tandem of Bell and Chase Powell. "With both Bell and Powell returning, they are a tandem that can break off some big returns," Maynor said. Bell averaged just under 20 yards per kickoff return, while Powell had a 95-yard kickoff return against Savannah State and averaged just over 21 yards per return.

## **SCHEDULE**

The 2017 schedule has a couple switches from last year as Morgan State and North Carolina A&T come off, while Bethune-Cookman and North Carolina Central come on. Hampton opens the

campaign against Ohio University on September 2 in Athens, Ohio at 7 pm. The Bobcats finished 8-6 last season and lost to Troy in the Dollar General Bowl 28-26.

"Longtime former Nebraska coach Frank Solich has gotten Ohio up to being a contender in the Mid-American Conference," said Maynor. "That will be a tall task to go up there and get a win."

Hampton starts a three-game homestand on September 8 with College Night as the Pirates begin MEAC action with Delaware State at 7 pm. The Pirates knocked off the Hornets 27-17 on a rainy October 8 matchup last season in Dover, Delaware.

On September 16, the Pirates will host former Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) rival Livingstone College at 6 pm for Alumni Day. This will be the first meeting with Livingstone since 1994 as the Pirates lead the all-time series 9-0.

Hampton will close September on the 23rd with a matchup against Big South member Monmouth University at 2 pm for Parents' Weekend/Greek Day. This will be the first-ever matchup with the Hawks who finished 4-7 last season.

After a bye week, the Pirates jump into the heart of the MEAC schedule with a road trip to Savannah State on October 7 before heading across the water to face Norfolk State in the Battle of the Bay on October 14 at 2 pm.

Hampton returns home to start two-games against the Florida members of the MEAC hosting Florida A&M on October 21 for Homecoming at 2 pm. The Rattlers knocked off Hampton last season in Tallahassee.

"We should have a great crowd for homecoming after losing to FAMU on their homecoming last year," Maynor said.

The Pirates venture to Daytona Beach on October 28 when they tangle with the Wildcats of Bethune-Cookman University at 4 pm. This is the first matchup since 2014 when the Pirates snapped a six-game losing skid to Bethune-Cookman with a 40-35 win at Armstrong Stadium.

"We didn't travel south well last year and will need to improve on that taking on a tough Bethune team on its Homecoming," Maynor added.

November will start with the defending MEAC Champions North Carolina Central University on the 4th at 1 pm for the annual Breast Cancer Awareness/Pink Game. Hampton leads the all-time series 18-7 after losing the last matchup 41-17 in Durham, NC during the 2014 season.

The last road trip of the season will take place on November 11 as the Pirates take on the Bulldogs of South Carolina State in Orangeburg, SC at 1:30 pm. Last year, the Pirates scored a 28-26 win to snap an eight-game losing streak to SCSU.

Howard comes to Armstrong Stadium on November 18 for the Battle of the Real HU/Military Appreciation and Senior Day for a 1 pm kickoff. The Pirates enter this game winning the last two matchups including a 34-7 win in Washington, DC in 2016.
