### PIRATES AGAINST THE COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

The Pirates are 10-24 against schools currently in the CAA. Hampton is 0-1 against Charleston, 1-5 against Delaware, 1-4 against James Madison, 1-2 against Towson, 0-1 against UNC Wilmington, and 7-11 against William & Mary. Hampton has never faced Drexel, Elon, Hofstra, or Northeastern.

### PIRATES ON THE ROAD

In head coach Edward Joyner Jr.'s first seven-plus seasons at the helm, the Pirates are 43-62 on the road, including an 8-7 mark last season. Hampton has won at least eight road games in three of its first seven seasons under Joyner – and in all three of those seasons, the Pirates made the postseason (2011 and 2016 NCAA, 2015 CBI). Hampton's best road mark came in 2010-11, when the Pirates were 8-5 in true road games.

### SCOUTING THE COLONELS

Robert Morris, in its seventh season under head coach Andrew Toole, is 0-5 so far this season following a 61-40 loss at Kansas State this past Tuesday. Sophomore guard Isaiah Still leads the Colonels in scoring, averaging 15.8 points per game, while senior forward Billy Giles is averaging a team-best 4.8 rebounds per contest.

### **SCOUTING THE SEAWOLVES**

Stony Brook, in its first season under head coach Jeff Boals, is 0-3 on the season after a 77-63 loss at Maryland this past Tuesday. Junior forward Tyrell Sturdivant leads four Seawolves in double figures, averaging 15.3 points per game, while also grabbing nine rebounds per contest. Redshirt freshman swing player Akwasi Yeboah is averaging 11 points and six rebounds a game.

### **SCOUTING THE TIGERS**

Towson, in its sixth season under head coach Pat Skerry, is 2-2 this season following an 80-70 loss at Boston College this past Tuesday. Junior guard Mike Morsell is averaging 20.5 points per game to lead the Tigers, while senior forward Arnaud William Adala Moto is averaging 18.0 points and a team-high nine rebounds per game.

### **LAST TIME OUT**

The Pirates dropped their second game of the Barclays Classic on Tuesday, falling 65-52 at Richmond despite 16 points from freshman Jermaine Marrow – who has scored in double figures in each of the Pirates' first four games this season – and three assists. AJ Astroth led Hampton on the glass, pulling down 11 rebounds.

### PIRATES PICKED TO FINISH THIRD

Despite winning back-to-back MEAC titles, the Pirates were picked to finish third in the conference this season in a poll conducted by the league's head coaches and sports information directors. Hampton, which returns just one starter from last season, picked up two first-place votes and racked up 250 points in the poll. Howard was tabbed the preseason favorite,

while South Carolina State – which fell to the Pirates in last season's MEAC Tournament championship game – was picked to finish second.

### **COOKS THE ONLY ONE**

Lawrence Cooks is the lone returning starter for the Pirates, and he comes into 2016-17 as the team's top returner in scoring (7.8 ppg), rebounding (3.7 rpg), assists (47), and steals (19). He is also the only player on this year's team that isn't a freshman, sophomore, or junior – though he does have two MEAC championship rings and NCAA Tournament appearances to his credit. Cooks dropped a career-high 22 points at Winthrop last season, a campaign in which he scored in double figures 11 times. Cooks had 10 points in Hampton's season opener against Rider.

### WILSON-FISHER LOOKING FOR A BIGGER ROLE

Charles Wilson-Fisher was a key role player in the Pirates' run through the MEAC Tournament in 2015, and he was a key reserve down low for the Pirates last season. 2016-17 could figure to be a breakout season for the Los Angeles native with the graduation of Jervon Pressley, and Wilson-Fisher will be looking to improve on his scoring and rebounding averages (2.7 and 2.5, respectively) this season. He tied his career high in points with 10 last season against Northern Arizona, and this past Friday against Rider, he set new career highs in rebounds (15) and blocks (two).

### STRONG START FOR MARROW

Three games into his collegiate career, freshman Jermaine Marrow leads the Pirates in scoring, averaging 13.8 points per game. He opened his career with 13 points against Rider, before dropping 11 points on Nov. 17 in an overtime win over Chowan and then scoring 15 points at Kansas State this past Sunday and dropping 16 at Richmond on Tuesday. The Heritage High graduate from nearby Newport News, Va. was 4A East State Player of the Year last season, proving to be one of Virginia's best scorers – averaging over 25 points a game in 2015-16.

### **ASTROTH MAKING AN IMPACT**

AJ Astroth was key in Hampton's win over Chowan on Nov. 17 – not just because he poured in a season-high 18 points and nine rebounds in just his second game with the program, but because it was his layup in the closing moments that gave the Pirates the lead. Astroth is third on the team in scoring, averaging 9.3 points per game.

### LOTS OF YOUTH

Of the 15 players listed on this season's roster, 11 are listed as either a freshman or sophomore. In fact, there are eight sophomores on this year's Pirates squad – including Branden Aughburns, Trevond Barnes, Kalin Fisher, Imani Miller, Akim Mitchell, and Devon Oakley, who were all role players on last year's championship team.

### **STAFF CHANGES**

While Edward Joyner Jr. is back for his eighth season as head coach, his staff will have a different look in 2016-17. Darryl Sharp will now serve as Associate Head Coach, while Matthew Hamilton has been moved from Director of Basketball Operations to assistant coach. In addition, Brian Graves, who had previously served as the head coach at Bryant & Stratton College, has joined the staff as an assistant coach.

### PIRATES IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Since moving up to NCAA Division I competition in 1995, the Pirates have made six trips to the NCAA Tournament – including each of the last two. Prior to the 2014-15 season, the most recent trip was in 2011, when Hampton fell 87-45 in the second round to top-seeded Duke. The 2014-15 season not only marked the program's fifth all-time appearance in the NCAA Div. I Tournament, it also marks the team's second win in the event, thanks to a 74-64 first-round win over Manhattan in the First Four.

Prior to 2011, the Pirates were last in the NCAA Tournament in 2006, when the Pirates fell 71-49 to Monmouth in the opening-round game in Dayton, Ohio.

Hampton's most famous trip to the NCAA Div. I Men's Basketball Tournament is also its first; in 2001, the MEAC champion Pirates, coached by Steve Merfeld, upended No. 2 seed Iowa State 58-57 in Boise, Idaho on a 4-footer from Tarvis Williams with 6.9 seconds left to play. Williams led the Pirates (25-6) with 16 points and 13 rebounds that afternoon, while Marseilles Brown added 14 points and LaSean Howard poured in 10 points.

Williams' bucket not only gave Hampton a win for the ages – and marked just the fourth time in tournament history a No. 15 seed had defeated a No. 2 seed – but it also provided one of the tournament's most vivid images: Merfeld, lifted into the air by David Johnson, fists and feet raised into the air.

The Pirates would fall in the second round that year to Georgetown 76-57.

Hampton also made the NCAA Tournament in 2002, falling 78-67 as a No. 15 seed to No. 2 Connecticut in the first round of the East Regional.

### ROBERT MORRIS HEAD COACH ANDREW TOOLE

Presiding over the golden age of Robert Morris University men's basketball is Andrew Toole, who is in his seventh season as the head coach of the Colonials in 2016-17.

Introduced as the eighth head coach in the program's 40-year Division I history at a press conference at the Charles L. Sewall Center May 11, 2010, Toole signed a two-year contract extension at RMU April 15, 2015, and will lead the Colonials through the 2019-20 campaign. In six seasons under Toole's tutelage, the Colonials have posted an overall record of 120-87 (.580), including a mark of 73-33 (.689) against Northeast Conference opponents.

Toole has overseen the most successful stretch in school history during his nine-year tenure at Robert Morris. Named an assistant coach under former head coach Mike Rice in 2007, Toole was elevated to associate head coach the following season before taking over the reigns as head coach in 2010.

During Toole's six seasons as head coach at RMU, the Colonials have claimed two NEC regular-season championships (2013, 2014), appeared in four NEC Tournament championship games (2011, 2012, 2014, 2015) and have made four national postseason appearances. Robert Morris played in its first CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) in 2012, earned automatic bids to the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) in both 2013 and 2014 and appeared in the 2015 NCAA Tournament.

Four of RMU's five victories in a national postseason tournament have come under Toole. In 2011-12, his second year as head coach, Toole led the Colonials to an overall record of 26-11 (.703). Robert Morris tied a school record for victories by advancing to the quarterfinals of the 2012 CIT thanks to road wins over Indiana State (3/13/12) and Toledo (3/17/12).

In 2012-13, RMU claimed its 10th NEC regular-season championship with a ledger of 14-4 (.778) in conference action and overall finished 24-11 (.686). Robert Morris earned a spot in the 2013 NIT, advancing to the second round thanks to a landmark 59-57 victory over Kentucky (3/19/13) in front of 3,444 fans at the Charles L. Sewall Center, the largest crowd in school history.

### STONY BROOK HEAD COACH JEFF BOALS

Jeff Boals was named head men's basketball coach at Stony Brook University by Director of Athletics Shawn Heilbron on April 9, 2016. He arrived at Stony Brook after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at Ohio State.

A member of Thad Matta's staff since 2009-10, Boals helped guide Ohio State to seven postseason appearances, including six NCAA Tournaments. The Buckeyes, who won or claimed a share of three Big 10 titles, advanced to the Final Four in 2012. Ohio State went 193-62 during Boals' time in Columbus.

Boals was instrumental in bringing some of the top players in the nation to Ohio State, including current NBA stars Jared Sullinger and D'Angelo Russell, along with Aaron Craft, the all-time steals and assist leader in Ohio State history. He also coached the 2010 National Player of the Year, Evan Turner, during his outstanding collegiate career with the Buckeyes.

Prior to Ohio State, Boals spent three seasons at Akron, serving as the team's recruiting coordinator and working with the post players. The Zips advanced to three Mid-American Conference championship games, winning the title in 2009. It was Akron's first NCAA Tournament berth since 1986. Boals also recruited Anthony "Humpty" Hitchens, a MAC All-Freshman Performer, and Zeke Marshall, a top-35 national recruit.

Boals spent two seasons (2004-06) at Robert Morris and four years (1999-2003) at Marshall. In his final season at Robert Morris, the Colonials posted their first winning record in 15 seasons. He also spent a total of four seasons at Division II University of Charleston in two different stints.

A 1995 graduate of Ohio University, Boals was a two-time captain and four-year letterwinner for the Bobcats, who advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1994. The following year, Ohio University won the Preseason NIT Championship after wins over Ohio State and No. 14 Virginia, as well as George Washington and New Mexico State at Madison Square Garden.

### TOWSON HEAD COACH PAT SKERRY

When Pat Skerry was announced as the 13th men's basketball head coach at Towson University on April 5, 2011, he took over a program that had endured 15-straight losing seasons.

The gritty Medford, Massachusetts native has turned Towson into one of the top programs in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). Towson has won at least 20 games in two of the last three years under Skerry. Since the start of the 2012-13 season, Towson leads the CAA with most conference victories at 42. The Tigers have participated in a postseason tournament in two of the last three years, including the Vegas 16 in 2016.

Skerry needed only two seasons to make everyone know he was the right man for the job.

After winning just one game during his first season, Skerry led the Tigers to an 18-13 record in 2012-13. Not only was it the first winning season since 1995-96, it was also the largest single-season turnaround in NCAA Division I history.

The achievement did not go unrecognized by his peers as Skerry was selected as the CAA Coach of the Year. He became the first coach to receive that honor since Terry Truax earned back-to-back Big South Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1992-93 and 1993-94.

The success continued during the 2013-14 season as the Tigers won a Division I record 25 games. This includes winning their first two postseason games as a Division I program in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

The 2013-14 season saw the Tigers end the year ranked 84th in the RPI, marking the first time Towson finished the season in the Top 100. The Tigers also received their first votes in the national polls when they were receiving votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll.

### 2016-17 PIRATES AT A GLANCE

The Hampton University men's basketball team is the twotime defending Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) champions; in each of the past two seasons, the Pirates have been the conference's representative on the sport's biggest stage. As the team continued racking up wins and bulldozing its way through the MEAC Tournament – scoring 80 points or more in each of the three games – the accolades kept coming.

But once the season ended, reality set in. Coming into 2016-17, head coach Edward "Buck" Joyner Jr. – entering his eighth season – finds himself with a roster that lost four starters and six letterwinners from a year ago. Among the losses? MEAC Male Student-Athlete of the Year Reginald Johnson Jr. and double-double machine Quinton Chievous. Both players were First Team All-Conference players a year ago.

Three-point specialist Brian Darden and post player Jervon Pressley have also moved on, as did key reserve Dionte Adams and Gregory Hayden. Three of the four starters lost averaged double figures in points last season.

So Joyner comes into 2016-17 with a roster that includes 11 underclassmen – and a new-look coaching staff. Darryl Sharp returns to the staff, serving as associate head coach, while Matt Hamilton has been moved up to assistant coach and Brian Graves joins the program after coaching at Bryant & Stratton.

### Returners

Guard Lawrence Cooks is the top returning scorer – and the only player who is not a freshman, sophomore, or junior –

for the Pirates. He averaged just under eight points a contest last season, and is also Hampton's top returner in rebounding (3.7 rpg), assists (47), and steals (19). He started in 21 games last season, scoring in double figures 11 times and recording a double-double (12 points, 13 rebounds) against Washington Adventist.

His career high in points – 22 – came in the season opener at Winthrop.

The most experienced returner – next to Cooks – is post player Charles Wilson-Fisher. After making four starts in 32 games last season, Wilson-Fisher has played in 51 career games at Hampton. Last season, Wilson-Fisher averaged 2.7 points and 2.5 rebounds in a reserve role last season, and he is the team's top returning shot blocker.

Wilson-Fisher, who tied his career high in points with 10 at Northern Arizona, did shoot 48 percent from the floor and 70 percent from the free throw line last season.

Among the Pirates' other nine returners, many will be looking at increased roles in relation to last season. Guards Kalin Fisher, Imani Miller, Akim Mitchell, and Devin Oakley will give the Pirates some depth in the backcourt. Fisher saw the most action of the four last season, averaging 12.6 minutes per game and pouring in just under four points a game.

Mitchell, who averaged nearly 11 minutes a game in 2015-16, was 80 percent from the free throw line.

Donald Ralls Jr. will also return for the Pirates; last season, he was on the back end of the proverbial depth chart along with Miller and Oakley. All three are likely to have larger roles this season, with the departures of Chievous, Johnson, and Darden.

In the frontcourt, the Pirates figure to receive larger contributions from Trevond Barnes and Branden Aughburns. With Pressley and Adams gone, Barnes and Aughburns now find themselves behind only Wilson-Fisher in the hierarchy of the frontcourt.

Barnes averaged six minutes a game last season, averaging 1.3 points and 1.4 rebounds a game, while Aughburns saw action in 12 games.

### **Newcomers**

Six players will be making their debuts in the blue and white this season for the Pirates – including local products Austin Colbert and Jermaine Marrow. Colbert, from nearby Chesapeake, Va., is a transfer from Old Dominion, while Marrow will join the program from Heritage High in Newport News.

Colbert, who will bring Div. I experience to the frontcourt, sat out the 2015-16 season for the Monarchs after transferring there from the University of Illinois. He was with the Illini for two seasons, and in 2014-15, Colbert averaged 1.7 points and 2.2 rebounds per contest.

In two seasons at Illinois, Colbert shot just under 53 percent from the floor.

Marrow was named the Daily Press' boys basketball Player of the Year this past April after averaging more than 30 points a game and leading the Hurricanes to the quarterfinals of the state tournament. In his first two games with Heritage last season, Marrow dropped 47 and 46 points, respectively.

And he did that while transitioning from shooting guard to point guard.

The Pirates will also welcome in guards Lysander Bracey and Jaekwon Carlyle – the former transferred to Hampton from Brunswick Community College, while the latter comes to the Pirates from Imhotep Charter School in Philadelphia, Pa.

Bracey averaged over 17 points a game for Brunswick last season, hitting nearly 40 percent of his 3-pointers.

Swing player Trey Carver also comes to Hampton from nearby Elizabeth City, N.C., where he averaged 18.5 points and nearly six rebounds for Northeastern High this past season. As a junior Carver averaged 18.5 points and 7.5 rebounds a game.

He grabbed 8.6 boards a contest as a sophomore.

Post player Rasheed Stanley, a 7-foot, 295-pound redshirt sophomore from Atlanta, Ga., will also join the team this season.

### Schedule

Hampton's 2016-17 slate includes five non-conference home games – including the first two games of the year. The Pirates open the season against Rider (Nov. 11) and Chowan (Nov. 17) – before hitting the road to take on Kansas State on Nov. 20 and Richmond on Nov. 22.

After competing in the Barclays Classic against the likes of Robert Morris, Stony Brook, and Towson, the Pirates will head to Greenville, N.C. on Nov. 29 to take on East Carolina – before returning home on Dec. 3 to take on local rival William & Mary.

A Dec. 7 game at Gardner-Webb will lead the Pirates into fall finals – after which, they will return to the Convocation Center to face Winthrop on Dec. 17. A Dec. 21 tilt at Appalachian State will wrap up the pre-Christmas portion of the schedule.

On Dec. 28, the Pirates will play at Princeton, before returning home on Dec. 30 to take on Coker College.

The Coker game will kick off a four-game homestand that will also see the Pirates square off against North Carolina A&T (Jan. 4), South Carolina State (Jan. 7), and Savannah State (Jan. 9). Hampton will also have home MEAC games against North Carolina Central (Jan. 16), Coppin State (Jan. 30), Maryland Eastern Shore (Feb. 1), Howard (Feb. 11), and Norfolk State (Feb. 27).

Road MEAC games include Delaware State (Jan. 14), Norfolk State (Jan. 21), Savannah State (Feb. 4), South Carolina State (Feb. 6), Bethune-Cookman (Feb. 18), Florida A&M (Feb. 20), Morgan State (Feb. 25), and Coppin State (March 3).

The 2017 MEAC Tournament will be held March 7-12 in the Norfolk Scope Arena.

In his first seven seasons as head men's basketball coach at Hampton University, Edward "Buck" Joyner Jr. has guided the Pirates to national prominence on more than one occasion – and that's not even counting the magical run Hampton made in March 2015 en route to an improbable MEAC championship, an NCAA Tournament win, and national notoriety.

This past season, Joyner guided the Pirates to a

21-11 overall record – their second 20-win season under his tutelage – and won the MEAC regular season title with a mark of 13-3 before defending the conference tournament championship. The Pirates again earned the MEAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament, earning a No. 16 seed in the Midwest Region and taking on Virginia.

Hampton won its first MEAC regular-season crown since the 2001-02 season.

Along the way, guards Quinton Chievous and Reginald Johnson, Jr. were First Team All-MEAC honorees. Both players ranked top four in the conference in scoring, and Chievous – one of only a handful of players nationally to average a double-double – led the MEAC in overall rebounding, offensive rebounds, and defensive rebounds.

Johnson was also named the MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, averaging 19.3 points and 8.3 assists per contest in those three games. He tied a MEAC Tournament record with 13 assists in the quarterfinals against Morgan State.

Chievous was also named to the MEAC's All-Tournament Team.

With a 61-48 win at American on Nov. 17, 2015, Joyner picked up his 100th career win as a head coach. His 120 wins are the most among Div. I coaches in program history, and Joyner is third overall in terms of career wins, 20 wins shy of Malcolm Avery (140 wins, 1987-95).

Despite going 8-8 in MEAC play in 2014-15 and winding up with a No. 6 seed, the Pirates went on to win four games in six days in the conference tournament, taking their second MEAC Tournament crown under Joyner with an 82-61 win over Delaware State in the title game.

In claiming the MEAC crown, the Pirates upset the No. 3, No. 2, and No. 5 seeds.

The Pirates then wound up in the NCAA First Four in Dayton, Ohio to take on Manhattan. Hampton won that game 74-64 for the second NCAA Tournament win for

the program at the Div. I level – and the first since the 2001 upset over Iowa State – before taking on No. 1 seed Kentucky in the second round.

The win gave the Pirates an unprecedented level of national exposure – exposure helped by a press conference sound-bite from Joyner that went viral and made Hampton tournament darlings leading up to its second-round contest against Kentucky.

Overall, Hampton has made four postseason appearances under Joyner; in addition to NCAA appearances the past two seasons and in 2011, the Pirates competed in the College Basketball Insider (CBI) Tournament in 2014.

Joyner became the program's all-time winningest Div. I coach on Feb. 7, 2015 with a 64-61 win over Maryland Eastern Shore, surpassing Steve Merfeld (90 wins) on the program's all-time wins list.

Along the way, Deron Powers was named the MEAC Tournament Most Outstanding Player – after earning Third Team All-MEAC honors – and Reginald Johnson was named to the All-Tournament Team.

With the help of associate head coach Akeem Miskdeen, Joyner instilled a new philosophy leading into the 2013-14 season. Faced with a young but talented team, Joyner is looking to instill a philosophy of discipline, toughness, and passion (DTP) in the Pirates.

In discipline – getting players to do things the right way every time on and off the court – Joyner quotes Aristotle: "We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence is not just an act; it's a habit." Nothing great, according to Joyner, is ever accomplished without discipline.

By giving the Pirates toughness, Joyner and his staff hope they will be able to withstand great strain without tearing or breaking. The Pirates will have to be tough, fighting through adversity – physical, mental, and emotional – on and off the court.

By instilling passion, Joyner and his staff want the Pirates to embrace being student-athletes, in every sense of the term. If the players truly love what they do, that passion will make being disciplined and tough easier.

Through DTP, Joyner wants a team that plays hard, unselfishly, with confidence, and with passion – believing that builds the foundation of a successful basketball program. The Pirates, through DTP, should take the simple game of basketball and play it aggressively, while simultaneously reaching their full potential on and off the court and never losing sight of their goals.

Joyner also hopes DTP will be a good tool for teaching important life lessons.

The Pirates won 18 games in 2013-14, finishing second in

the MEAC with a mark of 13-3. Despite falling in the quarterfinals to Coppin State, Hampton made its second postseason appearance under Joyner, competing at Penn State in the first round of the CBI Tournament.

The Pirates ended the regular season on a seven-game winning streak, a stretch that included season sweeps over rivals Howard and Norfolk State. As a head coach, Joyner is 9-1 overall against Howard and 6-6 against Norfolk State.

Along the way, senior forward Du'Vaughn Maxwell was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, leading the conference with 3.2 blocked shots per contest and ranking third in the MEAC in rebounding with 7.5 a game.

Maxwell was also a First Team All-MEAC selection.

In Joyner's fourth season with the Pirates, Hampton went 14-17 overall in 2012-13. However, the Pirates went 11-5 in conference play, finishing third in the MEAC after winning a head-to-head tiebreaker over Savannah State. Hampton closed out the regular season with nine wins in its last 12 games, as a young squad began to mesh and show its potential.

Leading that charge was freshman point guard Deron Powers, who was named the MEAC Rookie of the Year after leading the Pirates in both scoring and assists last season. Powers was second in the MEAC in free throw percentage and fourth in assists.

Powers was also named a Mid-Major Freshman All-American by CollegeInsider.com.

The Pirates struggled to a 12-21 record in 2011-12, though Hampton did advance to the semifinals of the MEAC Tournament in trying to defend their 2010-11 crown. Along the way, the Pirates upset No. 1 seed Savannah State in the quarterfinal round 59-46. That win was also the 50th in Joyner's young coaching career.

Darrion Pellum, who was a senior in 2011-12, led the team and the MEAC in scoring, earning First Team All-MEAC honors after averaging 18.3 points per game. Pellum was also named VaSID First Team All-State.

Joyner led the Pirates to the 2011 MEAC Tournament championship in his second season, guiding Hampton to a 24-9 record – marking the first time the Pirates won 20 games since the 2001-02 season. The Pirates were the No. 2 seed in the MEAC Tournament, defeating Morgan State 60-55 in the championship game to win the tournament and win the automatic NCAA bid for the first time since 2006.

Hampton earned a No. 16 seed, facing top-seeded Duke in the first round.

Joyner saw two of his athletes earn All-MEAC honors, as Pellum was named First Team All-MEAC after finishing the season second in the conference in scoring and junior guard Kwame Morgan was named Second Team All-MEAC after a breakout season. Pellum, the MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, was also named VaSID Second Team All-State, BASN HBCU Second Team All-American and NABC All-District 15, while Morgan was named a Lou Henson All-American and NABC All-District 15.

Joyner was also named BASN HBCU Coach of the Year for his efforts.

The Pirates overcame offseason tragedy and went 14-18 in 2009-10, Joyner's first season as head coach, finishing tied for fifth in the MEAC with an 8-8 record. He led the Pirates to the MEAC Tournament semifinals, beating archrival Norfolk State in the quarterfinals 73-70. Despite struggling to find consistency for much of the season, Hampton won six straight games to close out the regular season and open the MEAC Tournament, before falling to top seed Morgan State 74-67 in the semifinals.

Senior guard Vincent Simpson earned Second Team All-MEAC honors for the second straight year under Joyner, leading the team with 14.1 points per game. Both Simpson and senior forward Michael Freeman eclipsed the 1,000 career point mark in 2009-10.

As an assistant coach, he helped develop such players as Simpson, first team all-conference guard Rashad West, the MEAC's leading scorer in 2006, and Michael Freeman, the 2006 MEAC Rookie of the Year. As academic coordinator, Joyner guided the men's basketball program to the highest team GPA in 10 years.

Joyner came to Hampton after 11 years as the assistant head coach at Johnson C. Smith University in Charlotte, N.C. He also served as the lead assistant coach on the women's basketball team in the last five years of his tenure at Johnson C. Smith. Joyner also served as assistant to the Dean of Students over judiciary affairs.

Joyner played his collegiate ball at Johnson C. Smith, earning letters all four seasons he played. He helped guide the Golden Bulls to three division titles, two trips to the CIAA championship game and three appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament. Joyner was named Defensive Player of the Year twice, and he finished his career among the top-ten assist leaders in Johnson C. Smith history.

A native of Winston-Salem N.C., Joyner is the son of Edward Joyner Sr., former head basketball coach at St. Paul's College, and the nephew of Steve Joyner, the head basketball coach and athletic director at Johnson C. Smith.

Joyner received his Master's degree in sports administration from Hampton University in May 2016. He is married to the former Aerian Miller and they have three children: E.J., Andrew, and Layla.
