# Sports Information

## Maurice Williams Sports Information Director



Maurice Williams is entering his fourth year directing the Office of Sports Information for Hampton University. He joined the staff in September of 2007.

Williams handles the day-to-day functions of the Office of Sports Information, and he currently serves as the primary media contact for all sports outside of cross country, track and field, sailing and golf – while also handling in-game statistics for all of the university's teams. He is also the secondary contact for all other sports at the University.

Williams is also responsible for all content and material on the university's athletics website HamptonPirates.com. His office writes and edits all athletic publications, including game programs and media guides, and coordinates all press conferences and interviews with Hampton student-athletes, coaches and staff.

In addition, Williams serves as the game day program editor for both football and men's and women's basketball, handles all credentials requests for the Hampton football and both basketball teams.

During Williams' tenure at Hampton, the university has seen 16 All-American selections, six football players signing with NFL teams, 20 Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholars and one Arthur Ashe Jr. Male Sports Scholar of the Year (Marcus Dixon, 2008).

Prior to becoming the Director of Sports Information at Hampton, Williams served in the same capacity at Shaw University. Prior to his time at Shaw, he spent five years at Livingstone College as a student assistant and as an intern.

While at Shaw, Williams helped coordinate the publicity efforts for the school's 14 intercollegiate athletic teams and served as the primary contact for all of the University's sports. Williams also assisted in the marketing and promotions efforts while at Shaw.

Williams currently holds memberships in the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and the Black College Sports Information Directors' Association (BCSIDA). At CoSIDA, Williams serves on the Committee-on-Committees Committee and the Academic All-American Committee.

Williams is a native of Allendale, S.C. and a 2005 graduate of Livingstone College, where he earned a bachelor's degree in English. While at Livingstone, Williams helped coordinate the publicity efforts for the school's 13 intercollegiate athletic teams. He worked as a statistician for the Blue Bears' football, softball, volleyball and men's and women's basketball teams. In addition, he served as the primary media contact for men's basketball, volleyball and softball and assisted with football, track and field, cross country and women's basketball.

## Derrick Coles Assistant Sports Information Director



Derrick Coles is entering his first year as the Assistant Director of Sports Information. On top of assisting with the day-to-day activities of the Office of Sports Information, Coles is the primary media contact for women's basketball, volleyball, bowling and men's and women's tennis. He is also the secondary media contact for football.

Before coming to Hampton, Coles spent six years as an assistant within the athletic department at Virginia Union University. His duties included assisting the sports information department with programs, media guides and game-day activities, as well as working with the compliance office in reviewing academic records, practice schedules and athlete eligibility matters.

Coles received his Bachelor's degree in marketing from Virginia Union in 2007, before earning a Master's in sports management from Virginia State in 2009. Coles, a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, is a native of Richmond, Va. and his volunteer work includes the Special Olympics, the Rudy Johnson Foundation, the James Farrior Foundation, Richmond Sports Backers and Upward Sports Academy.

# 2010 Lady Pirates Volleyball: ONE TEAM, ONE DREAM

The 2010 Hampton University women's volleyball team has a lot to prove this year. Despite the disappointment of this past season, where the Lady Pirates (9-19, 4-6 MEAC) missed out on the MEAC Championships after losing a three-way tiebreaker with Howard and Morgan State, head coach Pedro Gonzalez remains confident.

"This year's team has learned that nothing is given to them. After losing a three-way tie for third and fourth place really hurt the ladies," Gonzalez said. "They realized that they should always give it their all."

This season, the Lady Pirates are ready for the challenge of proving they belong at the top of the MEAC North ern Division. They are returning 11 players, including all seven starters from last season.

Gonzalez is entering his fourth season as head coach and he has high expectations for this season. "We have the talent and the skill, but we need to believe it," he said. "We need to come together and play as one - One team, one dream."

## **SENIORS WITH THEIR EYES ON THE PRIZE**

The Lady Pirates have seven upperclassmen that will lead the team this year. Senior Aaryn Harrison (6-0, RH, Cary, N.C.) led the team in kills with 228 and averaged 2.30 per set.

"Aaryn has been with me from the beginning. I like to say that she helped me build this program from the ground up," Gonzalez said. "She has the ability to be the conference MVP, but I don't think she realizes it. I expect her to go all out this season, go out in glory, and be remembered."

Senior Lina Cordoba (6-2, MB, Bogota, Colombia) is due for a breakout year. Last season, Cordoba was fourth on the team in kills (129) and second in blocks. Lina recorded a season team-high in aces last season with five against Winston-Salem State on Sept. 19 and blocks with nine against North Carolina A&T on Sept. 25. She will be a key player defensively for the Lady Pirates.

"She should be our primary go-to person," Gonzalez said. "Every year she has had one the highest kill percentages on the team. She's a strong hitter, tough blocker and an overall great person. I expect great things from her this season."

Another senior that the Lady Pirates need to continue her dominance this season is Ivana Suput (5-8, L, Zitiste, Serbia). The vocal leader on the team, Suput led the team in digs last season with 391, placing her second in the MEAC.

"I believe Ivana is the best libero in our conference," Gonzalez said. "I expect her to be the spark plug for the team. Out of everyone on the team, she has played at the highest level of volleyball in native country of Serbia and one season in the SEC. Ivana is going to have a big role on this team in terms of leadership. She is going to have to be the stability on the court."

Senior Brittney Wynne (5-9, OH, Sacramento, Ca.), will also be a force on both sides of the net. She was second on the team in kills (210), third in serve aces (23), fourth in blocks (31), and fourth in digs (116). Last season, she had a team high in kills with 23 on Sept. 19 against Winston-Salem State.



“Brittany is a prototypical volleyball player; she is now learning to use her natural athletic ability to its fullest potential.” Gonzalez said. “I believe this will be a great year for her.”

### **ELKAYAM & ARMSTRONG ARE READY TO SEIZE THE MOMENT**

Junior Lihi Elkayam (5-7, S, Misgav, Israel) led the team with 698 assists and had an average of 7.84 per set, which was fifth-best in the MEAC.

“Lihi did a great job last year. She is doing a great job learning our system,” Gonzalez said. “As long as she keeps running a fast paced offense, we should be in a great position. She is a tough competitor who doesn’t quit. A natural born leader with a great feel for her team.

“She’s been the setter for the past two seasons, and that experience will help this team come together. Her experiences, both in making the MEAC Tournament and just missing out on that, will provide her with the leadership skills necessary to take this team where it needs to go.”

Junior Mianna Armstrong (5-9, OH, Lomond, Alberta) is the most versatile player on the team. She was third on the team in kills (173), second in points (201.5), and second in digs (200), while recording nine double-doubles on the season. Armstrong, who led the Lady Pirates last season with 2.90 kills per set in MEAC play, will continue to contribute to the success of the Lady Pirates.

“Mianna’s performance has been a bit of an oddity, for some reason she has not done well against non-conference opponents,” Gonzalez said. “But when we begin our conference schedule, she does an amazing job. She has carried this team for the past two years and I think she will continue to for the next couple of years. She is an intelligent player with a high volleyball IQ.”

### **FRESHMEN EQUIPPED TO COMPETE WITH THE BEST**

Juliana Chavez is one of Gonzalez’s new recruits from Bogota, Colombia. This 6-foot setter is a transfer from Pratt Community College. Chavez was an All-Conference/All-Region player for the Beavers, where she both set and hit on the right side during each of her two years. She finished the 2009 season hitting .197 with 136 kills. Chavez led the team with 4.5 assists per game, and was also second on the team with 25 aces on the year. Chavez finished her academic career with a 3.82 GPA this spring and an overall 3.51.

“She will bring a big block on the net for us,” Gonzalez said. “She has experience as hitter, so she will be used as a setter and a hitter.

“Juliana will also push Lihi hard this year. She is a great setter. Juliana is a dynamic athlete and will compete every day in the gym.”

Petra Parros is a highly-recruited freshman who chose Hampton as her home for four years. Parros is a 6-foot outside hitter from Bloomfield, N.J., where she was a standout at Immaculate Heart Academy. She had 142 kills, 31 blocks, and she hit 56.3 percent.

“Petra Parros, she will be an amazing player to see,” Gonzalez said. “She has both the physical and mental aspects I like in a player. She will bring great athletic ability to our team. Since she can play both outside and middle blocker -- I expect great things from her.

“We’re fortunate to have these two young ladies join the Hampton University volleyball program.” This Lady Pirates have experience, talent and skill, which they will need to be successful. If Hampton has the same dream, to win the MEAC Championship, then this could be a season for the ages.

# HEAD COACH PEDRO GONZALEZ



Pedro Gonzalez is entering his fourth year coaching the Hampton University volleyball team, looking to build even further on the foundation he has already set for the program.

The Lady Pirates went 9-19 overall in 2009, including an early-season 3-0 victory over the U.S. Naval Academy, while going 4-6 in MEAC play for the second straight year. Hampton missed out on the MEAC Tournament after losing a three-way tiebreaker with Howard and Morgan State, though the Lady Pirates continued to make progress and shined in conference play. Ivana Suput was second in the conference in digs with 3.91 per set, and Mianna Armstrong led the team in MEAC play with 116 kills (2.90 per set), while also recording 123 digs in conference action (second only to Suput).

Gonzalez led Hampton to a 6-28 record in 2008, with the Lady Pirates going 4-6 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference to earn a bid to the conference tournament for the first time in five years. Though the Lady Pirates fell in the quarterfinals to eventual MEAC champion Florida A&M, that step was a sign of progress for a program looking to rebound.

Gonzalez led the Lady Pirates to an 11-19 record in 2007, despite being a late-summer arrival, and coached two All-Conference performers. With his first two seasons at Hampton behind him, Gonzalez has hit the recruiting trail in search of national and international talents so the Lady Pirates can compete in the upper echelon of the MEAC.

Gonzalez is a native of Las Milpas de Los Gonzalez, Sinaloa, Mexico, but grew up in the suburbs of Los Angeles. After a decorated high school career, Gonzalez moved on to Mount San Antonio Junior College, where he earned team MVP honors. He finished his collegiate career and graduated from the University of La Verne in La Verne, Calif. with a degree in psychology in 2002.

Gonzalez's coaching background includes extensive summer camps in the volleyball-rich state of California, as well as Kansas. His first collegiate job came at Colby Community College (Kan.), where he was named assistant coach in 2003. The team went 26-19 that year, and Gonzalez took over as head coach the following season. From 2004 through 2006, Gonzalez compiled a record of 67-59 while leading six All-Conference players, three Academic All-Americans, three All-Region performers and one First-Team All-American in Ana Kokanovic.

During his tenure, Gonzalez found success in the Kansas Jayhawk Conference, earning a top-three finish in 2005 and a runner-up finish in 2006. His teams were among the top 20 academic programs in NJCAA Division I, with a team cumulative GPA of 3.0 and higher. Gonzalez was also active in the classroom at Colby, teaching Social Psychology, General Psychology, Current Political Issues and Conversational Spanish.

Gonzalez still plays competitive indoor and sand volleyball, and is also a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association.

# LEGEND OF THE PIRATES

A Pirate by any other name ... might have been called a Seaside.

Yes, “Smooth Sailing For Seaside” may have been a typical headline for Hampton University athletics if the results of a May 1933 election had been different.

Thomas Young, staff member of the Norfolk-based Journal and Guide, first suggested the poll because of the confusion encountered by those who made reference to Hampton’s athletic teams. Young first suggested the name Pirates while writing for the newspaper.

“Young, an alumnus of Hampton ... wrote a glowing account of a football game in which he referred to Hampton as the Pirates,” stated the April 23, 1933 edition of the Journal and Guide.

Following a conference with Hampton University athletic director C.H. Williams, it was decided that the school’s student newspaper, The Script, would conduct a poll of the students to decide the school’s official mascot.

In announcing the poll, The Script listed the most widely-used names for the Hampton teams, which included such names as Ironmen, Seaside, Wildcats and Pirates.

Enoch Walker, editor of The Script, preceded the news of the election by saying, “Here’s your chance to do a bit of constructive and immortal work. The name the students select will be Hampton’s monicker now, henceforth, and forever more.”

Five hundred seventy-seven of the 989 Hampton students cast ballots. Pirates received 307 votes, while Seaside garnered 184. Ironmen finished third with 74 votes and seven ballots were cast for Buccaneers.

Just five students voted for Wildcats.

In August 2002, Hampton University unveiled the third athletic logo in the institution’s history. With the Pirates athletic program becoming a more frequent topic of conversation in the world of sports, it was only fitting that Hampton be recognized by a new and improved look.

The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) enters its 41st year of operation heading into the 2010-11 academic school year. The MEAC is made up of 13 outstanding historically black institutions across the Atlantic coastline: Bethune-Cookman University, Coppin State University, Delaware State University, Florida A&M University, Hampton University, Howard University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Morgan State University, Norfolk State University, North Carolina A&T State University, North Carolina Central University, Savannah State University and South Carolina State University.

## **HISTORY**

In 1969, a bold ad hoc group of innovators long associated with intercollegiate athletics met in Durham, N.C., to discuss the feasibility of organizing a new conference. Dissected from these discussions, a steering and planning committee was formed to fully investigate the idea, present a detailed report with recommendations to interested collegiate institutions, and then construct a workshop to outline proposals.

After adopting a program, seven institutions (Delaware State College, Howard University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Morgan State University, North Carolina A&T State University, North Carolina Central University and South Carolina State College) agreed to become the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. Its major objective was to establish, organize and supervise an intercollegiate athletic program among a compact group of educational institutions of high academic standards and with a sound philosophy of co-curricular activities. The conference agreed to seek Division I status for its sports.

The conference was confirmed in 1970, kicking off its first season of competition in football in 1971.

In 1978, a milestone was reached when the MEAC selected Kenneth A. Free to be its first full-time commissioner. Free served the conference for 18 years before stepping down in May of 1996. In July of 1996, Charles S. Harris was named commissioner and served in the capacity until April 2002. On September 1, 2002, Dr. Dennis E. Thomas was named the commissioner and has served in the position for nine years.

The conference's first expansion occurred in October 1979 when Bethune-Cookman College and Florida A&M University were voted into the MEAC as new members. Original members Morgan State, North Carolina Central and Maryland Eastern Shore withdrew from the conference at the end of the 1979-80 fiscal year. Maryland Eastern Shore was readmitted in 1981 and Morgan State returned in 1984. Florida A&M opted to resign in 1984 but rejoined the conference in 1986. Coppin State College was granted admittance in 1985, becoming the ninth member institution.

The MEAC expanded again in the 1990's with the inclusion of Hampton University (1995) and Norfolk State University (1997). The conference expanded in 2007 adding Winston-Salem State University. Following the 2009-10 academic/athletic season Winston-Salem State withdrew from the conference and returned to Division II. On July 1, 2010 the MEAC made its final expansion with the admittance of North Carolina Central and Savannah State University.

On June 8, 1980, the MEAC was classified as a Division I conference by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). Prior to that year the conference operated as a Division II conference. The following month the MEAC received an automatic qualification to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship.

Currently, the conference has automatic qualifying bids for NCAA postseason play in baseball (since 1994), men's basketball (since 1981), women's basketball (since 1982), football (since 1996), softball (since 1995), men and women's tennis (since 1998), and volleyball (since 1994).

The MEAC initiated cross country in 1980 and North Carolina A&T earned the inaugural men's crown. The first women's cross country championship took place a year later with Howard winning the first of its seven titles. Indoor Track and Field was also added in 1981 with South Carolina State capturing the men's title and Howard winning the women's crown.

Tennis and golf returned as MEAC governed sports in 1981, after a five-year hiatus. South Carolina State won all seven of the conference's golf championships from 1972-1983 before the sport was discontinued after the 1983 championship.

Morgan State dominated the conference in wrestling winning 13 of 24 conference championships during the sports tenure (1972-1995).

Baseball, which began in 1972, was discontinued following the 1977 season. It was brought back as a MEAC governed sport along with women's volleyball in 1983. Women's softball became a MEAC sanctioned sport in 1992.

Bowling was officially sanctioned as a MEAC sport in 1999. Before that season, the MEAC was the first conference to secure NCAA sanctioning for women's bowling by adopting the club sport prior to the 1996-97 school year.

## **SPORTS HIGHLIGHTS**

The MEAC has enjoyed tremendous athletic success over the years. In 2008, Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) defeated Arkansas State 4-2 to win the NCAA Women's Bowling National Championship, a first for the conference and institution. With the victory, Lady Hawks' head coach Sharon Brummell became the first female head coach to win a NCAA bowling title.

In men's basketball, UMES became the first historical black college/university to participate in the 1974 National Invitational Tournament (NIT). The Hawks defeated Manhattan, 84-81, in the first round before falling to Jacksonville by two points in the second round. Before the Jacksonville loss UMES had the best record in the nation at 27-1.

That same year, Morgan State won the NCAA College Division II National Championship and junior Marvin "The Human Eraser" Webster was named the Division II Player of the Year.

The 1981 tournament champion Howard Bison became the first MEAC team to play in the NCAA Division I Basketball Championship.

Coppin State and Hampton made history in the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament with first-round victories. The No. 15 seeded Coppin State defeated No. 2 South Carolina in 1997 and No. 15 seeded Hampton defeated No. 2 Iowa State in 2001. Both victories ranked among the Top 10 greatest tournament upsets of all-time by ESPN's SportsCenter.

In women's basketball, South Carolina State won the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) Division II National Championship in 1979.

In 1982, Howard became the first MEAC women's team to participate in the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. South Carolina State earned the conference's bid in 1983 and became the first MEAC team, men or women, to win an opening-round game in the NCAA Division I Basketball Tournament.

The No. 14 North Carolina A&T Lady Aggies faced No.3 Florida State in the 2009 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Tournament. The 14th seed was the highest seed earned by a MEAC women's basketball program since the inception of the 64-team bracket in 1994.

The Lady Aggies defeated Wake Forest and Charlotte before falling to Miami in the third round of the 2010 Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). North Carolina A&T became the first MEAC team and historical black college/university to win two consecutive basketball games in a national postseason tournament.

In football, the MEAC was instrumental in constructing the Freedom Bowl All-Star Classic, the Heritage Bowl, and the Gold Bowl.

Prior to Division I competition, the MEAC competed in the Gold Bowl held in Richmond, Va., which matched the MEAC champion against the champion of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA). South Carolina State represented the MEAC in 1976 and 1979, winning both outings over Winston-Salem State and Norfolk State respectively.

In addition to the 1976 and 1979 crowns, South Carolina State won MEAC football titles in 1974-78, 1980-83, 1994, 2004, 2008 and 2009. During the 1981 and 1982 seasons they reached the second round of the I-AA championships.

In outdoor track and field, North Carolina Central won the first three MEAC outdoor titles and finished fourth in the 1974 NCAA Division I Men's Outdoor Track and Field Championship. NCCU's Larry Black was a member of the 1972 Olympic 400-meter relay team that won the gold medal. He won the silver medal in the 200-meter dash.

MEAC women began outdoor track and field conference competition in 1980. In 1982, South Carolina State won the AIAW Division II Outdoor Track and Field National Championship.



The MEAC has showcased over 27 athletes in the Olympics and 11 have earned medals during the Summer Games.

In 2003, Florida A&M became the first MEAC school to win a volleyball match in the NCAA Championship, with a first-round win over Winthrop. In 2004, the Lady Rattlers became the first historically black college/university to rank in the Top 25 of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) national poll.

South Carolina State's women's tennis team earned the conference's first Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) ranking in a 2005 final poll reaching a No. 72 ranking.

In softball, Bethune-Cookman earned the conference's first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Softball Championship in 2005. The Lady Wildcats defeated Florida, Central Florida and South Florida in the Florida Regional to become the first MEAC school to win a NCAA Division I Softball Regional. Bethune-Cookman ended the 2005 season with the conferences' first-ever rankings in the final softball polls, reaching No. 18 in the NFCA/USA Today Coaches poll and No. 23 in the USA Softball/ESPN.com Poll.

Florida A&M was the first MEAC baseball team to advance to NCAA postseason play in 1994. The Rattlers took on Southeastern Louisiana in a best of three play-in series, falling after two games, 11-10 and 8-7. During the 2002 campaign, the Bethune-Cookman Wildcats advanced to the Gainesville Regional and became the first MEAC team to win in the NCAA Tournament with a 7-4 victory over Florida International. The Wildcats had previously lost to Florida in their first game 13-1 and were eliminated from the regional with a 21-10 loss in their second matchup against the Gators.

## Florida A&M and Maryland Eastern Shore Picked to Win Divisions



VIRGINIA BEACH, Va., July 21, 2010- Howard University outside hitter Gazelle d'Artois was named the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Volleyball Preseason Player of the Year the conference announced today. Preseason honors were voted on by the conference's head volleyball coaches and sports information directors.

The Florida A&M Lady Rattlers and Maryland Eastern Shore Lady Hawks were picked as the preseason favorites in the southern and northern divisions, respectively. Florida A&M received 18 out of 22 first place votes, while Maryland Eastern Shore tallied 20 points in their respective divisions.

D'Artois, a 2009 All-MEAC First Team Selection, was second in the conference in kills per set (3.76) and points per set (4.23). She averaged 0.48 assists and 0.27 aces in 122 sets. Defensively, she added 2.21 digs and 0.35 blocks per set.

Florida A&M posted a 8-0 conference mark and a 17-10 overall record in 2009 en route to their ninth consecutive MEAC title. The Lady Rattlers return six starters and seven letterwinners from last year's championship team.

The Lady Hawks recorded an unblemished 10-0 conference mark for the third straight year and a 24-7 overall record in 2009. They welcome back five returnees including preseason All-MEAC outside hitter Christine Edwards, middle blocker Samantha Chukwura, and 2009 MEAC Rookie of the Year Bella Jade Romero.

Joining d'Artois, Edwards, Chukwura and Romero on the preseason team are Delaware State's Erica Tajchman and Florida A&M's Susan Egoavil.

In the southern division, Bethune-Cookman was predicted to finish second with 189 total points and two first-place selections, South Carolina State also tallied two first-place votes (186), followed by Norfolk State (161), and North Carolina A&T (143).

Delaware State recorded a school record 8-2 mark in conference play a year ago and was picked to finish second in the northern division with two first-place votes and 198 total points. Morgan State (166) was tabbed to finish third, followed by Howard (151), Hampton (148) and Coppin State (113).

Conference play begins on Monday, October 4 with the defending MEAC champion Florida A&M Lady Rattlers traveling to Norfolk, Virginia to take on the Norfolk State Spartans.

The 2010 MEAC Volleyball Championship will be held November 19-21 in Baltimore, Maryland on the campus of Coppin State University
